CO-CHAIRS' UPDATE

- Thank you to all school council voting members for their contributions to Council this
 year and thanks to all the members not returning. Thanks to our teacher rep who has
 moved to a new school and to last year's student reps.
- Welcome to all members of the Northern community and to the new voting council members.
- TDSB Supervision:

- the Province placed the TDSB under supervision and elected trustees have been removed from their roles and replaced with a single Supervisor. We should watch this process closely as information and support to parents may change.
- School Council has been approached by the Samara Centre for Democracy about the possibility of surveying our parent community about their views of provincial supervision. This is something that the new voting members can review.
- Development on Roehampton there is a proposed development across the street from Northern on Roehampton. Public consultation will take place on October 22nd. Look for more information in the Parent Post as it is available.
- Things for Council to monitor in the coming years:
 - Support for the Student Nutrition Program. Renovations are underway which will limit the available food options during this time. Student Success will almost certainly run out of money this year and will need support.
 - Road Safety around Northern. Traffic around Northern can be heavy when students, cars, buses, etc.. Advocacy to improve safety for our students may be required.
 - Upgrades to the back field. We have previously discussed looking into partnership opportunities to allow upgrades to the back field that are a priority. The TDSB has indicated that work cannot be started until work on the boilers is complete. This project may require advocacy, fundraising and other support from Council.
 - Possible policy changes affecting Northern. We will need to stay informed about decisions being made by the Supervisor. Key areas that may be affected:
 - Pools in schools (including Northern's pool)
 - Access to Schools Without a Boundary (including at Northern)
 - The size of the incoming Gifted cohort (there is room to add more)
 - Northern's centennial. This is five years out. It may be an excellent opportunity to implement the courtyard improvements that have been discussed. This may require fundraising with the parent community and will involve more than one year of planning.

ASK ADAM QUESTIONS

1. How safe is it for a student to park a bike at school?

A: Very safe, but there can be 1-3 bikes that go missing each year. It can be under a security camera. The people who take them are well disguised, work quickly and look for expensive bikes. I recommend bringing a second-hand bicycle to school and leaving expensive bikes at home.

2. The TDSB is no longer providing 1-to1 devices in Grade 9. Are there any options for school devices or do we need to purchase them?

If your child is coming from a TDSB school, they should have been given a device to take with them. Reach out to your previous school to inquire about this and let me know if you can't sort it out that way.

3. Where can I find a current list of clubs/sports teams?

Go to the Northern website for the list of teams and clubs. The list is not fully up-to-date as new clubs are currently going through the approval process. By Thanksgiving weekend, you should be able to find an up-to-date list on the website. You can also go to the announcements page for updates. There's a link in the weekly bulletin.

4. How did classroom reorganizations affect Northern this fall?

Classroom reorganizations didn't impact us. If classes are over cap sizes, you need to split classes. This was not the case at Northern this year.

Principals Report

• There is a brand new HVAC system in the school and the work is ongoing. There will be air conditioning in the library. All throughout the school there are holes in walls, ceilings, floors and new ductwork. New pipes were added for the boilers over spring and summer and the work is ongoing. The school is permitted for Learn For Life classes on on Monday nights, so less work can take place those nights. The bulk of the work will shut down on October 15th when the heating system switches on and will pick up again once the heating system is turned off.

- Enrollment at Northern is less than what was planned. We pushed the Board to expand our catchment area, as we are pulling in less than 70 students from the area. Grade 9 classes were 525-550 students in the last few years. This year it was capped at 425. In Grades 10 to 12, we always expect some students to leave Northern (they move, change school boards, attend private school, etc.). This is not an insignificant number. Because we no longer have large commercial and technical boundaries, we cannot draw new senior students from those areas. Altogether, we are almost down 200 students, which could mean losing 8-10 of our newest teachers. These new teachers bring a lot of energy and personal time to the school. We support asking questions like can we add a 4th gifted cohort or additional LD students. Ideally, we would like to keep our numbers at 1900-2000 students. If we start to lose two digit numbers of staff in a year, we start to lose the things that attract students to want to come to Northern.
- We are fully staffed at Northern and are currently interviewing for office staff. Finding a
 ceramics tech person is challenging. There are currently two lifeguards and the pool is
 open every day.
- Parking at school is challenging. Two students were hit at lunchtime everyone is fine.
 Construction coming to the south could lead to additional congestion. School buses,
 taxis, Wheel-Trans are picking up kids. We have cars speeding through the parking lot
 as a cut through. We're not sure what the solution is for this yet. Being vocal early
 about the construction across the street is a good strategy.
- Room 143 is taking shape. Mr Wong is working there and it looks amazing.
- There is a lot coming up at school: awards ceremony, informal marks update, PA day, parent/teacher meetings and SAC leadership retreat through outward bound. Around 800 IEPs are currently being written.
- Jessica Pearson, VP, has left the school as she was promoted to Principal. Ms Beach is our new VP and a great addition to the team.
- The school is looking to engage in messaging about risks of social media and the sharing of intimate images. There have been situations where a student is invited to an online group where inappropriate things were shared and then police got involved. Parents should be aware.

- Al usage: the school can't use Turnitin.com because it is an American company. All of us need to be aware of the issues with Al and academic integrity. The school is considering bringing in experts from our local universities to talk to Northern staff about how they currently deal with the use of Al by students.
- Thank you to the outgoing School Council for the conversations, transparency and patience. Council has done a good job promoting the gathering of parents and building community.

COMMITTEE REPORTS

Budget Committee

Sarah Flint

- We had \$17,615 to spend in 2024-2025 and were happy to be able to invest just over \$15,000 towards Student, Classroom and Parent Enrichment. We ended the year with a surplus of \$2537, slightly above our target of \$2000. The carried-over funds are used to fund Student Awards handed out in October, the parent social after Curriculum night, and any funding requests received before funds are available from this year's School Cash Online Campaign.
- We were thrilled to restock the guidance department with tampons, deodorant, toothpaste, toothbrushes, and other miscellaneous hygiene items for their student supply cart. We expect these supplies to last until January, and we will consider a restock then.
- We've received our first request for funding this fall, to be reviewed by our Budget Committee.
- The way funding works, submissions are received by the Budget Committee who rank them against our funding matrix which takes into consideration: Community Impact, Provincial / National Exposure based on Achievement, Skill Building, Self Initiated Fundraising, Duration of Impact and finally the # of students involved. This gives us a multiplier (i.e. \$25/student) which we then multiply by the number of students



participating which gives us the suggested funding amount. We also make funding decisions on a one-off basis depending on the situation.

In Person and Virtual

- Any expenses under \$1000 can be approved by a majority of the Budget Committee, Any requests \$1000 and over will be brought to the full council for a vote. Our Budget Committee will share the link for funding requests. A lesson learned from last year is to save some funds for the spring when many clubs qualify for national and international level competitions, i.e. Robotics, Ethics Club
- The TDSB provides \$1500 to our Council to help us run the council, bank fees, etc, and also for Parent Engagement. We realized (too late) last year that we can use these TDSB Allocated Funds - applied towards Parent Nights - STEM Workshop & Arts & Tech Night, with Adam's approval.
- A draft budget for the upcoming year has been prepared and will be shared with the incoming Co-Treasurers who will present this year's budget for voting at the next meeting.
- School Cash Online campaigns are underway, we have received contributions of \$5,550
 to date. Have also received donations through the tax-receiptable avenue but it could
 take months for these funds to become available for us
- Last year we raised \$10,500 through our School Cash online campaigns; the goal is \$12,500 for this year.
